

Kansas City, Kansas is a melting pot of new immigrants, long time residents, and people of varied ethnic backgrounds. Bethel Neighborhood Center is our American Baptist ministry making a difference amid this mix. Vital ministries at Bethel include after school and summer programs for elementary to high school kids, vacation Bible school, ministries to senior adults, skills training, and a food pantry

To better minister to the community, Bethel has undertaken a \$1,700,000 project to add a multipurpose room and make other improvements. The multipurpose room will be a space for exercise, indoor sports, and large gatherings. Bethel has a capital funds campaign to raise \$800,000 to complete the project.
