One day, while on vacation, we ventured across the street, over to Heritage Park. The kids wanted to play on the playground and Kelsey wanted to take a walk along the pond. At some point Kelsey and Emerson began to walk and Max and I stayed at the playground. Eventually other families began to arrive. Kids connected with kids and a game of tag broke out.

As I watched, I was taken back to my childhood. For me, games of tag were a daily occurrence on the playground at school. I was reminded that, though I was fleet of foot for my size, there were many kids I knew I would never be able to chase down. On normal days, those who I knew I would never catch, were the ones I didn't even attempt to tag. On abnormal days, when the slower kids were not around, once tagged, I faced the unenviable task of tracking down kids I knew I could never catch.

Sometimes life feels like a normal game of tag. Always running to play the game, most often enjoyable, but sometimes exhausting. Then there are days, or even seasons, that feel like an abnormal game of tag. Always playing and chasing, but never catching. These are the seasons of doubt and struggle.
