## A NOTE FROM PASTOR REED

In 1991, when I was just ten years old, the movie City Slickers came out. Even as a child this movie was memorable and had an impact on me. The movie follows three 40 year old men from Manhattan who find themselves living largely unfulfilling lives. Along the way these men partner with other wannabe cowboys at a dude ranch where they assist real-life cowboys in driving the herd home. The journey that they take is full of laughs, trials, tragedy, and ultimately triumph.

At one point in the movie the grizzled old cowboy, Curly, played by Jack Palance, has a heartfelt conversation with Mitch Robbins, one of the dissatisfied city slickers, played by Billy Crystal. As Curley and Mitch slowly ride side by side, Curly, with a cigarette hanging from his lips, says in his grizzled tone, "do you know what the secret to life is?" Mitch quizzically responds, "No, what?" To this response Curly holds up one finger. Mitch replies, "Your finger?" At this point Curly lets him in on the secret, "One thing, just one thing, you stick to that and nothing else don't mean anything."

As a church there are so many things that we could focus on – many of them good, many worthwhile – but only one is necessary. Only one thing should drive us. When all else is stripped away we exist for only one purpose. For us who call FBCO home that one thing is encapsulated in our mission statement, Drawing our communities and world into a deeper relationship with God.

Over the coming months, all who call FBCO home will be invited to join the Diaconate in a visioning process. Please engage in the process by first praying, second speaking up, and third participating in the two Values Workshops we will have.
